## INSTRUCTIONS

### INSPIRATION

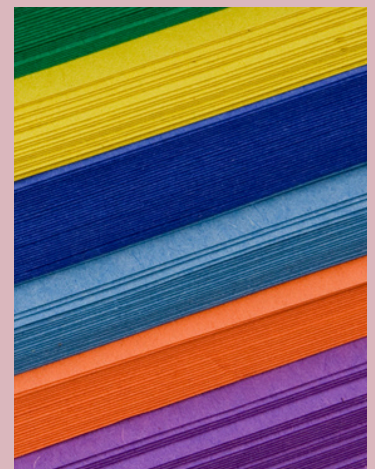
Taking Inspiration from Wayne Thiebaud's colorful food and bright desserts, students will create their own ice cream creations that celebrate God's beauty and abundant gifts.



### SUPPLIES

#### Gather:

- Crayons or Oil Pastels (Various Colors)
- 5x7 pieces of water color paper
- 8.5 x 11 or 11x18 Construction Paper (Various Colors)
- Water color colored Pencils

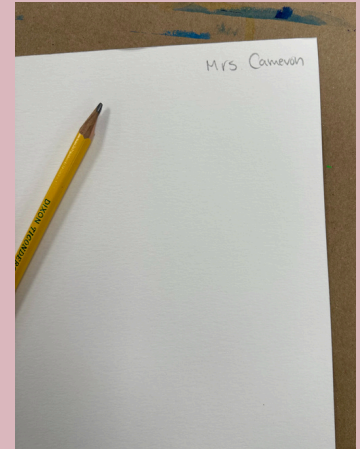


# ART LESSON

## THIEBAUD TREATS

### GETTING STARTED

- **Select Paper:** Have students select their favorite color of construction paper.
- **Name:** Next, pass out the water color paper and have them write their name on the back of the paper.



### BUILD THE TREAT

- **Cone:** Using brown crayons or oil pastels, outline a large V shape for the ice cream cone. Fill in with criss crossing lines.
- **Scoops:** Next, create stacks of ice cream scoops using different colors to represent your favorite flavors.



### CONNECT AND COLOR

- **Details:** Add a Cherry on top as well as sprinkles and chips to the layers.
- **Watercolor:** Fill in each layer of the ice cream cone with watercolor paint or fill in with watercolor pencils and get wet with water.
